

Printing to PowerRIP 2000 from PageMaker 6.5 using Make Composites from Separations

PowerRIP 2000 recognizes named spot and custom colors in print jobs and selects the best CMYK match for your printer, ink and paper combination. This is accomplished by using PowerRIP 2000's ability to output a composite using **Make Composites from Separations**.

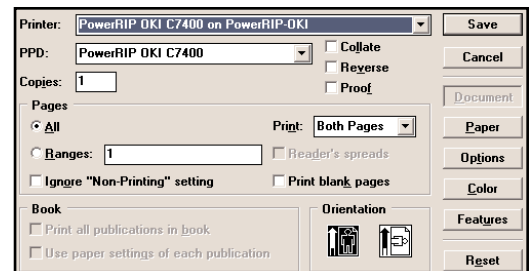
Note: - Before you print from PageMaker you must copy the appropriate PPD for your printer from the US folder in the PPD folder in the PowerRIP 2000 folder on your hard drive to **PM65>RSRC>USEGLISH> Ppd4**.

- It is assumed that a PageMaker 6.5 file is on the screen and ready to be printed.

Step 1: Go to File>Print.

The Print Document dialog will display.

Select your printer in the Printer pull down.
Select the appropriate PPD.

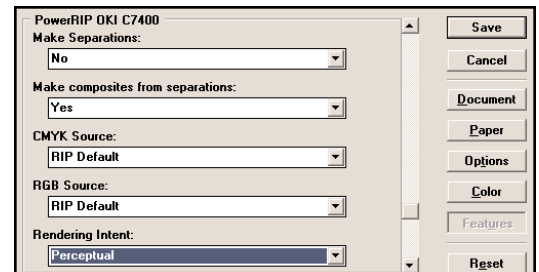


Step 2: Click Features.

The Print features dialog will display.

Note: This is a scrollable dialog.

Select **Yes** in Make Composites from Separations.
Select the rest of the Features to meet your needs.
For an in-depth discussion of all the available features for your printer see Chapter 9 of the PowerRIP 2000 manual.



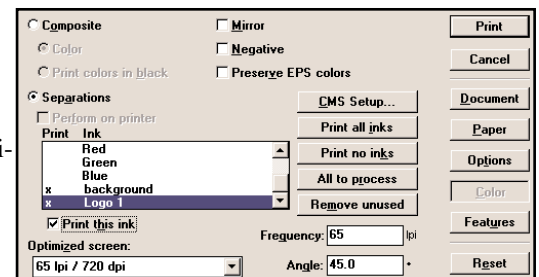
Step 3: Click Color.

The Print Color dialog will display.

Select **Separations**.
Select your custom colors with **Print this Ink**.
Click **Print**.

If this is the first file you are printing, PowerRIP 2000 will automatically launch. Auto launch will only happen if you have installed PowerRIP 2000 on your c:\ drive. If it is installed on any other drive, you will have to manually launch. To manually launch go to Start>Programs>PowerRIP 2000>PowerRIP 2000.

You will see the file start processing, rendering, and see PowerRIP 2000 create separations and then recomposing and print. After the file is done printing your custom spot colors will be saved in PowerRIP 2000's **Spot Color Configuration**.



Printing to PowerRIP 2000 from PageMaker 6.5 using Make Composites from Separations (Cont)

Spot Color Configuration

To access Spot Color Configuration go to **Inputs>Folder Scanners**. Click on **Specify Settings**. Go to the **Separations** tab. Select **Make Composite** which will make **Edit/Define Spot Colors** active. Click on **Edit/Define Spot Colors**. Your custom colors are displayed under Defined Spot Colors.

If you highlight your custom color the percentage of color you have defined has also been saved. Your custom color will be saved in Spot Color Configuration for future use until you decide to delete them with Delete Spot Color.
